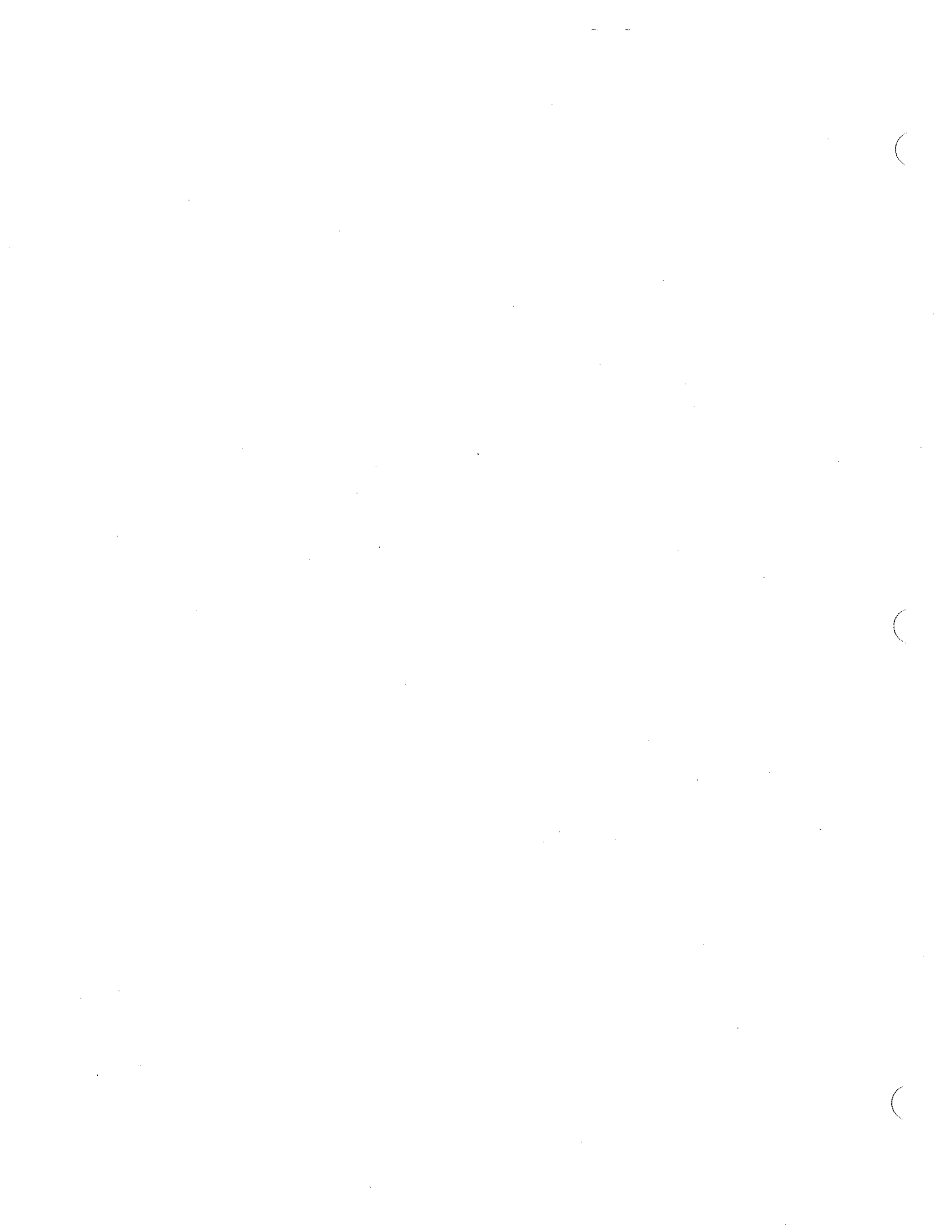

This was one of the best english/literature courses I have taken at UVM. The readings were all very interesting, engaging and enjoyable. I found the addition of student run poetry conversations to be very interesting and found that they helped students to engage more in other areas of the class. However, I do feel that the work load was a bit high in terms of the # of works we read and feel that a lighter load would have allowed for more analysis.
